# Faith, Wellness, and You

Now that we are seeing more of the sun, it's time to think about skin protection and early diagnosis of skin cancer. Ways to prevent skin cancer include: applying sunscreen, seek shade, protect your skin with clothing, use extra caution near water or sand, get Vitamin D safely, consider using a self-tanning product if you want to look tan, and check your skin for skin cancer. A tan is a sign that your skin has been injured. Where you're exposed to the sun's ultraviolet rays (or from visiting an indoor tanning salon) your skin is damaged. As this damage builds, you speed up the aging of your skin and increase your risk of all types of skin cancer. Melanoma is the deadliest form of skin cancer. Early diagnosis and treatment are crucial and improve the survival of skin cancer. It is estimated that one in five Americans will develop skin cancer in their lifetime. You should check your skin often for changes, if you notice a spot that is different from others, that changes, itches or bleeds, you should make an appointment with your healthcare provider or dermatologist.

Did you know...? It is recommended to always wear sunscreen with an SPF of at least 30.
