Faith, Wellness, and You

June is Alzheimer's and Brain Awareness Month. Dementia is a general term for a decline in mental ability that interferes with daily life. Alzheimer's is a disease that attacks the brain and is the most common form of dementia. There is no cure for Alzheimer's, but there are medications that are available to help ease symptoms. There are different stages to show how the disease unfolds, but progression will vary greatly from person to person. Growing evidence indicates that people can reduce their risk of cognitive decline by adopting key lifestyle habits. These include: regular cardiovascular exercise, continued education, quit smoking, good heart health, wear a helmet, eat a healthy balanced diet, get enough sleep, take care of mental health, stay socially engaged, and challenge your mind with things such as jigsaw puzzles or games. A diet of lean fats, vegetables and fruits is also a great way to protect the brain. A diet high in sugars and processed foods may contribute to dementia.

Did you know...? If you suspect that you or a family member/friend is showing signs of dementia or cognitive decline, it is very important to be evaluated by a healthcare provider as some dementia-like symptoms can be caused by treatable conditions, such as depression, drug interactions, thyroid problems, vitamin deficiencies, etc. You can contact your parish nurses at: Diane: 218-255-1270 and Tiffany at 218-252-8227.
