Faith, Wellness, and You

Every 11 seconds, an older adult is seen in the ER for a fall related injury. The National Council on Aging has 6 steps to Prevent Falls. Find a good balance program...both Matter of Balance and Tai Chi are evidenced based programs, this helps build balance, strength, and flexibility. Talk to your health care provider, which includes assessing your risk of falling. Regularly review your medication with your doctor or pharmacist, this includes making sure side effects aren't increasing your risk of falling. Get your vision and hearing checked annually and up-date your eyeqlasses. Your eyes and ears are key to keeping you on your feet. Keep your home safe, remove tripping hazards, increase lighting, make stairs safe, and install grab bars in key areas. Talk to your family members, enlist their support in taking simple steps to stay safe. Falls are not a normal process in aging, it's important to do something to prevent them before you fall. Did you know...? Many falls are preventable. There will be a free weekly class starting Oct. 24th for anyone who has fallen before or is interested in improving balance, flexibility and strength. You can sign up by calling Living at Home at 732-3137. CHI-SJ also offers a bi-weekly Tai Ji Quan class to improve balance, cost of the Tai-Ji Quan class is \$100 and runs for 12 weeks, sign up by calling Alicia at 218-616-3008.
