Oil for your Lamp

Last weekend, opening weekend of the local deer season, is almost a perfect reflection for today's Gospel. To protect the innocent, I will not use names, but rest assured they know who I am writing about! A deer was shot, but the shot was not correctly placed, so the deer ran away wounded. With the recent snow fall, there was ample tracking snow so the deer was tracked after a short time. The two hunters, a father and his son, jumped the deer and tried to put it out of its misery, but missed. This happened a couple more times, before the son looked sheepishly at his dad and said, "Dad, I am out of bullets". Dad simply said "I guess we have to go back to the truck and get some more". Faith, Wellness, and You

Depression is a common problem among older adults, but it is NOT a normal part of aging. In fact, studies show that most older adults feel satisfied with their lives, despite having more illnesses or physical problems. However, important life changes—like the death of a loved one or living with a chronic illness—that happen as we get older may cause feelings of uneasiness, stress, and sadness. Know the signs and symptoms of depression! Although these can vary depending on the individual, some of the most common symptoms are listed below. Discuss with your provider if you have some of these symptoms for more than 2 weeks. Persistent sad, anxious, or "empty" mood, feelings of hopelessness, guilt, worthlessness, or helplessness, irritability, restlessness, or having trouble sitting still, loss of interest in once pleasurable activities, decreased energy or fatigue, moving or talking more slowly, difficulty concentrating, remembering, making decisions, difficulty sleeping, early-morning awakening, or oversleeping, eating more or less than usual, usually with unplanned weight gain or loss, aches or pains, headaches, cramps, or digestive problems without a clear physical cause and/or that do not ease with treatment, or frequent crying. _ If you are thinking about harming yourself, tell someone who can help immediately, or go to the emergency room immediately.
