Oil for your Lamp

So, how are you doing with your Lenten observance? Anybody still looking for something to do in order for Lent to be more fulfilling; here is an idea, but it does not end with Lent. In light of the recent school shooting in Florida, why not adopt a law enforcement officer? I have a list of current peace officers of our community who would greatly appreciate prayers for their safety, for their family's well-being, for the community they serve. The local Hubbard County Law Enforcement Chaplaincy is trying to organize the various churches into supporting the officers in prayer. They are also planning to help the sheriff and the chief of police, purchase body armor for the individual officers. This armor is rated to stop bullets fired from high powered rifles. The current body armor they have is rated to stop "normal" hand gun loads. The cost for the body armor is approximately \$1400.00 for each officer. The weight of the armor is such that it will not be worn at all times, but will be in the officers vehicle at all times and will be put on during an "active shooter" situation. IF you are interested please contact me and let me know how you can help to purchase this sadly needed item for our officers. Faith, Wellness, and You

February is teen dating violence month, where discussions about the rising epidemic of teen dating violence are encouraged. These discussions focus on the physical, sexual, and psychological abuses that can be present in relationships between teenagers across the country. Approximately one out of every 10 high school students or 1.5 million teenagers is physically abused by a boyfriend or girlfriend. Physical abuse at a young age is often a precursor for intimate violence between adult partners. Victims of teenage dating violence are also more likely to engage in selfdestructive behaviors. If you are a parent of a teenager, take the initiative to speak with your teen about teen dating violence, listen for signs that they may be affected by teen dating violence, and let them know you are there for them.
