## Oil for your Lamp

So, the question raised by the Gospel this week is this, are you a shepherd or a hired man? When the chips are down do you run and hide, or do you stand your ground? Both are the same question just in a different format. When we speak in a religious setting, we always ask the Holy Spirit to fill us and give us strength, like he did with Peter in the reading from Acts, but when we are in a secular setting, we forget that the Spirit is still there with us (or do we)? How often do we reject the Holy Spirit, who is the cornerstone, when we take a stand either as a shepherd or when the chips are down. Often the Holy Spirit is a forgotten part of the Trinity, we focus our prayers to Jesus or God or even to Mary, with the hope that she will present them to Jesus or to God the Father. In a few short weeks we will celebrate the Feast of Pentecost, which is the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the Church. Maybe over the next few weeks we ought to "double down" our prayers and ask the Spirit to pour out his gifts upon us as we move out of a position of the hired man into a position of a shepherd; that is of one who will stand his ground when the chips are down, always placing our trust in the Cornerstone of the Church. "Come Holv Spirit. live in me. strengthen me, pour out your gifts upon me. Be my rock, my cornerstone of truth, and always lead me to the Eucharist, where you are one with the Father. In the True Presence of Jesus."

Did you know... The Catholic Church is deeply committed to protecting children from abuse and holding people accountable for inflicting such pain. In December 2021, the revised Book VI of the Code of Canon Law went into effect. This is the most recent of several documents that specifically address the issue of the abuse of children. Other documents include Vos estis lux mundi and Vademecum. These documents expand the acts which are considered abusive, clarify the manner in which the cases are processed, and hold people accountable for their action or inaction with regard to processing of a case. Of significant importance is attention given to the care of victim survivors and all who have been harmed. Bishops in the US lead the way for these changes with the implementation of the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People 20 years ago. Today every diocese and eparchy must have in place systems for tending to those who have been harmed, protecting those in our care and seeking restorative justice.
