#### Oil for your Lamp

Hard to believe that Lent starts on Wed! Lynn was telling me that I needed to fill in some space in the bulletin, so I crawled out of hibernation, put away my fishing pole for a little while and picked up the scriptures. As I read through the first reading, I found it guite interesting, especially with Lent almost here. I encourage you to read the passage again, (Sirach 27:4-7), "The fruit of a tree shows the care it has had." The next six weeks give us a chance to improve the fruit we bear. It is said that it takes about 6 weeks to develop new habits. What new habit would help you to produce better fruit with your life? Perhaps try putting your phone away for an extended length of time. Maybe try getting out for a walk, enjoying the weather, especially after the few weeks we just "endured". Perhaps you could go visit a neighbor who has been cooped up without visitors. Enjoy a cup of coffee and some good conversation (face to face not just text). Perhaps spending a little (more) time reading scripture, instead of scrolling on your phone. All of these will help keep your lamp burning.

#### **Fasting and Abstinence**

Ash Wednesday, March 5, and Good Friday, April 18, are days of fasting and abstinence. Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence.

Fasting is to be observed by all who are 18 years of age or older, who have not yet celebrated their 59<sup>th</sup> birthday. On days of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all who are 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fasting and abstinence, consult your parish priest.

# Faith, Wellness, and You

Early prenatal care and proper nutrition can make a big difference. Schedule regular prenatal visits. Avoid harmful substances like alcohol, tobacco, and drugs. Take prenatal vitamins containing 400 mcg of folic acid. Eat a balanced diet rich in folic acid, iron, and calcium.
